

With this duo, the interdisciplinary French artist **Clotilde** and the acclaimed American pianist and keyboardist **Chris McCarthy** deepen their collaboration.

Opening by Christy Bennett's Fumée Jazz Duo

Inspired by the Beat Generation poets Chris and Clotilde create a repertoire of rageous yet ecstatic original pieces in French and English, infused with the writings of idiosyncratic Beat Generation poet Diane di Prima. With this repertoire, they explore her identity crisis born out of poverty, of rebellion, of being a woman, of standing on the outside of the culture, of making bold choices in a more constraining world. "FREE them / FREE yourself / Help to FREE me / FREE us / DANCE " – Diane di Prima – Revolutionary Letter 49.

Pieces of a Song has been made possible through the Jazz & New Music, a program of FACE Foundation, in partnership with the Cultural Services of the French Embassy in the United States. Line up : Clotilde (vocal, flute) and Chris McCarthy (piano, prophet).

Clotilde also offers two classes on Vocal Resonance as part of the Chicago Paris Cabaret Connexion international conference.



PERFORMER PROFILES

MICHÈLE BARBIER began as actress and singer (Comédie Française, Festival d'Avignon, etc) but left everything for the circus, in Sweden, Germany and her own company in France. She was discovered in Sweden by the legendary Josephine Baker who engaged her as personal secretary from 1969-1971. After thirty years, Michèle returned to theater, writing and song; released three albums; published novels, historical essays, theater and poems; and produced her one-woman-shows evoking the circus world and more recently her upbringing in Algeria. She has created events, often televised, such as the Gala de la Presse and Kréatika, the Festival of Authors-Composers-Performers. She served as vice-president of the Alliance Francophone, taking her to many countries, most notably Japan. www.michele-barbier.com.

DALE CALANDRA specializes in directing/developing solo, concert, and cabaret shows, including his original character "America's Favorite Aunt!" AUNT LOLA CABANA. He has led Beckie Menzie, Brian Lasser, Charlene Brooks, Elizabeth Doyle, Carmen Severino, Lou Galecki, among many others, and directed over 100 productions, is founder of Center Theater Ensemble, was creative director of The Training Center, was artistic director of Illinois' oldest outdoor Shakespeare, has acted in over 200 productions, and played Edna in Hairspray in the first national Broadway Tour. www. CLOTILDE is an international interdisciplinary French artist, artistic director, vocalist-flutist and filmmaker. Her last album *A Woman's Journey* won sixteen awards including four awards as Best Album. Her second album *In* *Extremis* was named one of the top five albums by NPR Annual Jazz Critics Poll and by The Sunday Times. As a bandleader, she performs at renowned jazz venues and prestigious festivals around the world. Her recent creation *XXY* [eks/ eks/wai], a multidisciplinary music and motion art movie has been screened in 30 international festivals and has received five awards and nominations.

EVELYN DANNER is a vocalist/ actor/wardrobe mistress/teacher and costumer by day (most recently, costume designer for Goodman Theater's Gem of the Ocean) and professional performer by night. She has been with Chicago's Black Ensemble Theater for more than 25 years; singing, dancing, acting and most recently as "Miraculous Wardrobe Mistress." With more than twenty musical productions to her credit, Evelyn has portrayed the legendary jazz great Ella Fitzgerald in four different productions. She serves in the music ministry of her home church, Covenant Faith Church of God.

ISABELLE GEORGES transmits a iovful combination of French songs, classical music, musical theatre and Yiddish music. Her creativity has resulted in shows including: Une Etoile et Moi, Padam Padam, Broadway Enchanté, Amour Amor, Oh, La La!... For Yiddish Rhapsody, Broadway Symphonique or C'est Si Bon, Isabelle sought the company of symphony orchestras. This created a range of propositions that permitted her to perform in venues as diverse and prestigious as the Musikverein in Vienna, the Concertgebouw in Amsterdam, The Hyogo Performing Arts Center in Nishinomiya, the Théâtre des Champs-Élysées, the Bal Blomet and La Philharmonie in Paris, the Edinburgh Festival in Scotland, the 54 Below in New York. JEFF HARNAR has won multiple MAC, Bistro and BroadwayWorld Cabaret Awards and The Noel Coward Foundation Cabaret Award. Carnegie Hall appearances include both the Cole Porter and Noel Coward Centennial Galas. Televised PBS concerts include *The 1959 Broadway Songbook* with Music Director Alex Rybeck and *American Songbook: Stephen Sondheim* co-starring KT Sullivan. LYNNE JORDAN is a vocalist, bandleader, solo performer and storyteller. She is included beside Taj Mahal and Etta James on Blues Down Deep a tribute to Janis Joplin; performed in Jazz Operas in Europe; performed her one woman show: *A Great Big Diva*, and has traveled the world with her band Lynne Jordan and the Shivers. Lynne is the 2021-2022 Artist in Residence at the Raue Center for the Arts in Illinois.

MYLÈNE LAUNAY. French actress, dancer, street and cabaret singer, and creator, Mylène was trained in classical-dance, modern-jazz, tap dance, flamenco (at AID), Argentine tango (in Buenos Aires), musical comedy (AICOM). With accordionist Christian Bassoul, she co-hosts a weekly street ball at rue Mouffetard and performs cabaret events in Paris and the UK. Mylène wrote her first musical, *In Vitro*, in 2015. In 2017, she joined with Claudia Hommel to organize the Chicago and Paris encounters of the Cabaret Connexion.

AVA LOGAN is veterinarian by day and jazz singer/recording artist by night! Accompanied by piano and big band, Ava has performed at clubs and festivals from Bel Air and Beverly Hills to Moscow, Minsk, Paris and Rome, and all over Chicagoland. Theater performances include Ella Fitzgerald and Friends and Lena Horne and Friends at the Skokie Theater, and portrayals of Ella Fitzgerald and Nancy Wilson at Chicago's Black Ensemble Theater. HotHouseJazzMagazine described CHRIS McCARTHY as "one of the most imaginative and impressive voices on the New York jazz scene." Since arriving in New York, he has collaborated with established artists such as Jason Palmer and Lion Babe and with rising star, Sasha Berliner. McCarthy graduated with honors from the New England Conservatory in 2016. In 2017, he released his debut album Sonder, described by AllAboutJazz as "the promising and first release of many for this broad-minded and adventurous kevboardist."

MARGARET MURPHY WEBB.

Award-winning entertainer credits the tutelage of legendary tenor saxophonist Von Freeman. She has been featured at the Taste of Chicago, Winona Indiana Jazz Festival, Mississippi Valley Blues Festival; Chicago Blues, Jazz and Gospel festivals, Hyde Park Jazz Festival, Andy's, The Green Mill, Jazz Showcase, Pete Millers, Winters Jazz Club; performed for Presidents Obama and Clinton, and Russian and Polish ambassadors. Designated "Chicago's Jazz Hero" by Jazz Journalists of America for leading the nonprofit South Side Jazz Coalition. A Chicago Police Department veteran and breast cancer survivor, Margaret has stories to sing.

JEAN-CLAUDE ORFALI. Pianist, composer, conductor, Jean-Claude plays frequently in Paris from Le George V, le Plaza-Athénée et le Bristol to the oldest artistic cabaret, Lapin Agile. He joined the Chicago Paris Cabaret Connexion in Paris (2017) and Chicago (2018) as principal pianist, returned in 2019 to perform with Christine Steyer, taking their concert Sweet Spot between Our Worlds to Montréal. He composes and performs for film, as a solo pianist, as part of small jazz groups and also leads Parisian Big Band "BB15". jean-claudeorfali.com

PATRICK PERNET, pianist and arranger, alternates between studio and stage. He has accompanied an impressive array of artists, singers, comedians and humorists, with a repertoire for dance bands, jazz-rock bands, rock bands, country music, and French songs. He has directed, recorded and arranged more than a hundred albums. He appears on the album of New York singer Dawn Harden, Manu Dibango and other foreign artists. He is noted for his improvisational skills and comedy, and leading song workshops.

HOWARD PFEIFER. Joyful and melancholy, mixing the sweetness of the ballad, the energy of jazz and the sensuality of bossa nova, Maryline brings us along enthusiastically in French, English and Brazilian Portuguese. With Broadway credits Merrily We Roll Along and Grand Hotel. Mentored by Leonard Bernstein, Stephen Sondheim, Stephen Schwartz, Arthur Laurents, and Comden & Green, he has coached singers since 1982.

CHRISTINE STEYER. The 2020 Honored Artist of The American Prize for outstanding contributions to the arts, soprano Christine Stever has distinguished herself as an artist of great versatility. Steyer received acclaim for portrayals of Madama Butterfly and Violetta (La Traviata) and has sung in 40 productions at Lyric Opera of Chicago. With the Connexion, she sang in France at the Montpellier Opera House, Paris' Salle Olympe de Gouges and the Lapin Agile. Steyer has brought classical music to 23,000 youth in underserved areas. Additionally, she

has written award-winning librettos for Bellissima Opera's Tales of Transcendence: *On Call: Covid-19* and *Future Perfect*—the latter premiering this June.

Crowned "Chicago's Cabaret Queen" by the *Chicago Tribune, Sun-Times* and WGN Radio, **DENISE TOMASELLO** is winner of the After Dark Award for Outstanding Cabaret Performer and CCP's Gold Coast Award. Headlining with legends Don Rickles, Jackie Mason and Alan King she had performed at New York's Town Hall, and the Cinegrill and Gardenia in Los Angeles. With sold-out concerts at The Auditorium, The Drake , Park West, and Chicago Theatre, Denise is a Chicago music legend.

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
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JEFF HARNAR I KNOW THINGS NOW My Life in SONDHEIM'S Words

Orchestrated & Conducted by JON WEBER Directed by SONDRA LEE



Award-winning artist Jeff Harnar heard in the songs of Stephen Sondheim the story of his own life. That story was adapted into an acclaimed one-man show, and has now been expanded and preserved on disc in *I Know Things Now: My Life in Sondheim's Words*, a dazzling tapestry of over 25 songs – from familiar anthems like "Being Alive" and "Losing My Mind" to rarities like *Dick Tracy's* "Live Alone and Like It" and "More." Harnar weaves these songs into an original narrative, reimagining them for an LGBTQ+ audience, while renowned jazz artist Jon Weber – serving as conductor and orchestrator – recasts them in a jazz idiom, unleashing an orchestra of 20 in a radical reinvention of Sondheim's harmonies, one that the composer himself – upon seeing the show onstage – not only endorsed but encouraged. Now, PS Classics – Stephen Sondheim's label of choice for his final two decades – offers another jewel in its Sondheim crown: a highly original and personal celebration of the artist's work, by one of its foremost interpreters.
